SCC BACKGROUND AND RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Southeast Community College (SCC) is a public two-year institution established by the Nebraska Legislature in 1973 as one of six technical community college areas. The College has campuses in Beatrice, Lincoln, and Milford and six Learning Centers in its 15-county service area, in Falls City, Hebron, Nebraska City, Plattsmouth, Wahoo, and York. SCC offers applied career and technical programs, academic transfer programs, and continuing education in a variety of fields, including customized training for business and industry.

In 2014, SCC began a full-scale space needs analysis and facilities master plan with Clark & Enersen Partners. The results of that work led to a Facilities Master Plan that began implementation in 2015. Since that time and in implementing the plan, SCC has made incredible strides in facility improvements, demonstrating its ability to successfully complete the priorities of the **EMPOWER** campaign.

Jesse Butterfield, Computer Information Technology, Lincoln Campus

Jesse Butterfield has long been passionate about Information Technology, but this career seemed out of reach. In 2020, Jesse's employer closed due to COVID, leaving him with extra time. So, he built a website for his band and realized his dream career was in reach. Determined to enter IT, Jesse completed an introductory course at another institution but was turned down for an internship. He knew he needed to find an affordable way to continue his education and landed at SCC.

Jesse enrolled in the Computer Information Technology program and quickly landed a role as Information Security Intern with Ameritas. His time at SCC has been key to his success.

Average starting salary for graduates of SCC's Computer IT program is \$48,000; 97% of graduates get jobs in Nebraska. The Sandhills Global Technology Center will enable SCC to meet demand and enroll more students like Jesse, **EMPOWERING** both their career goals and Nebraska's workforce.

EMPOWER IMPACT IN THE FIELD

Alex Voichoskie, Agriculture Management and Production, Beatrice Campus

Growing up on a farm, Alex Voichoskie knew she wanted a career in agriculture. When it came time to go to college, Alex was looking for somewhere affordable but personal, with a program where she could "get her hands dirty." Most importantly, she wanted somewhere that felt like home.

SCC's Agriculture Management and Production program in Beatrice fit the bill. At an estimated cost of \$8,280, the program allows students to use the latest technology on a 600-acre lab. Students learn on the latest equipment and are given real-world experience.

By the time Alex graduated from SCC in 2018, she'd been named the Agriculture Program Student of the Year and received the National Association of Farm Broadcasting Grow Smart Scholarship. She went on to University of Nebraska-Lincoln and graduated in 2020. She now works at Nebraska Rural Radio Association as Multimedia Producer.

The new Agriculture Career Center in Beatrice will create opportunities for more students like Alex to make an impact in the field.
